Message from the Chief



As we close out 2024, I am incredibly proud of the dedication and professionalism of the men and women of the Watertown Police Department. Their tireless commitment, combined with the support of our community, continues to make Watertown a safe and welcoming place to live, work, and raise a family. This year, the WPD responded to 24,910 calls for service, reflecting our ongoing efforts to address crime, enhance public safety, and strengthen community relationships.

While simple assault arrests remained stable at 146, continuing a downward trend, aggravated assaults increased to 48. Violence of any kind is unacceptable, and we remain committed to reducing these incidents. Child abuse arrests rose to 17, though overall complaints declined, indicating improved early intervention efforts. Protecting our most vulnerable remains a top priority. Mental health and suicide prevention efforts continue to make a difference, with suicide incidents dropping to a

six-year low of three. While suicide threats (181) and attempts (53) remain high, these figures reflect increased reporting and outreach.

Traffic safety remains a focus, with vehicle collisions declining to 615, the lowest number in 15 years. This positive trend reflects improved vehicle safety, targeted enforcement, and education efforts. However, disorderly conduct complaints rose to 387, and family disturbances increased to 321, exceeding five-year averages. These increases mirror national trends and highlight the complex social and economic factors influencing community behavior. Addressing these challenges will be a key focus moving forward.

Property crimes continue to decline, with burglary complaints dropping to 26 and theft complaints reaching a historic low of 260. Meanwhile, DUI arrests increased to 304 due to enhanced enforcement efforts aimed at keeping our roadways safe. Juvenile crime saw a significant rise, with total arrests reaching 491, the highest in eight years. While juvenile drug arrests were among the lowest recorded, property crimes (76) and school disturbances (27) increased, reinforcing the need for stronger youth engagement initiatives in the coming year.

Community outreach remains at the heart of our mission, with 381 public announcements and social media updates keeping residents informed. Our youth cadets contributed 750 volunteer hours, and we facilitated 413 internship and ride-along hours, further strengthening our commitment to community policing.

Looking ahead to 2025, we recognize the need to address rising family disturbances, enhance youth engagement, maintain proactive traffic enforcement, and expand mental health initiatives. We will continue working alongside the community to build on our successes and tackle these challenges head-on. I extend my sincere gratitude to the residents of Watertown for their trust and partnership.

Law Enforcement Code of Ethics

As a Law Enforcement Officer, my fundamental duty is to serve mankind; to safeguard lives and property; to protect the innocent against deception, the weak against oppression or intimidation, and the peaceful against violence or disorder; and to respect the Constitutional rights of all persons to liberty, equality and justice.

I will keep my private life unsullied as an example to all; maintain courageous calm in the face of danger, scorn or ridicule; develop self-restraint; and be constantly mindful of the welfare of others. Honest in thought and deed in both my personal and official life, I will be exemplary in obeying the laws of the land and the regulations of my department. Whatever I see or hear of a confidential nature or that is confided to me in my official capacity will be kept ever secret unless revelation is necessary in the performance of my duty.

I will never act officiously or permit personal feelings, prejudices, animosities or friendships to influence my decisions. With no compromise for crime and with relentless prosecution of criminal, I will enforce the law courteously and appropriately without fear or favor, malice or ill will, never employing unnecessary force or violence and never accepting gratuities.



WPD Command and Supervisory Staff

The WPD Chief of Police is the chief law enforcement officer in the City. The Chief's authority is derived through appointment by the City Manager by and with the approval of the City Council, and holds the office for the term of appointment unless sooner removed by the City Manager. All police officers are under the control of the City Manager and Chief and are subject to their orders. The WPD command staff consists of the Chief of Police, Assistant Chief of Police, Reserve Chief of Police, and three Captains who oversee three divisions; Investigative, Patrol, and Administrative. Additional supervisory staff includes seven Sergeants, four of whom supervise patrol squads, one supervises detectives, one supervises administration, and the other supervises the community engagement division.

WPD Organizational Chart

The WPD consists of a formal organizational structure with clearly defined components so that the chain of command and functional divisions are clearly understood by all personnel. It is necessary that all personnel be sufficiently familiar with the structure, functions, activities, and services associated with the operation of the WPD to assist citizens of, and visitors to, the City of Watertown by ensuring that their inquiries or problems are referred to the proper organizational component.
